A Little History.....1999-2000 A 75 person Task Force was established to review the UNK Teacher Education Model. The Task Force was made up of P-12 Teachers and Administrators; TE Faculty; Arts and Sciences Faculty. Their charge was to review the existing model of TE. The Task Force made recommendations to develop a network of surround schools to form a “network” that would work with the College of Education.

Today.....there are 23 School Districts, ESU 10 and ESU 11 in the Network of Partner Schools, 65 individual sites, approx. 156 potential administrators, approx. 2,500 K-12 teachers and approx. 25,000 students.
