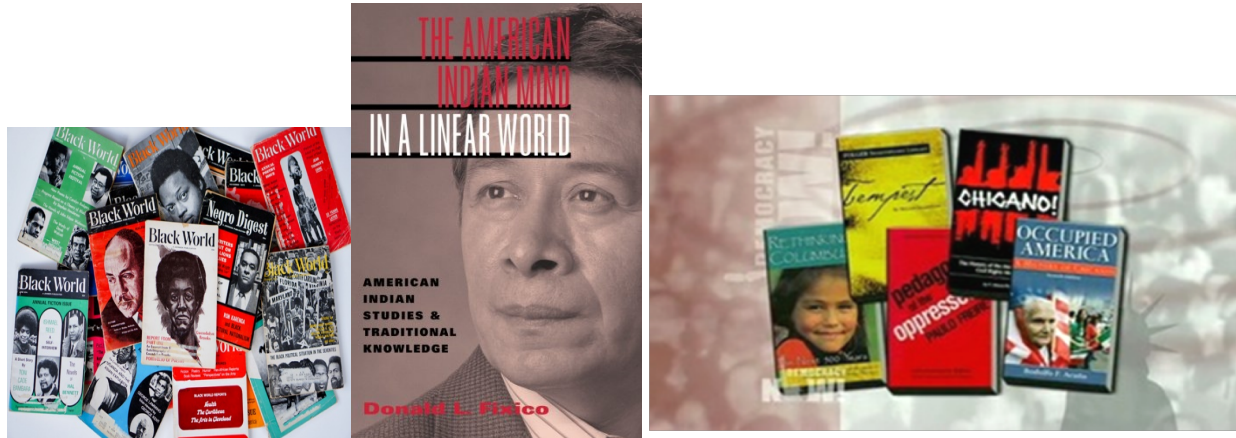


Ethnic Studies
