Positive Psychology& Active Listening

This month's Leadership UNK class session was held in West Center with the College of Business and Technology and was focused on Positive Psychology and Active Listening.

The class began with coffee provided by Brewed Awakening and covered by the Leadership UNK board. The class then went into their book discussion, which covered quite a few topics.

Greg Benson, Marketing & Supply Chain Management Program Chair, led the group through an active listening activity. The class learned that even when given directions, it is still good to ask questions because sometimes we perceive communication differently. Greg Benson talked in length about how important active listening is and how things can become easier or easier to navigate when you ask questions.


