As Nebraska's rural comprehensive university, UNK must meet a broad set of needs to support the business, workforce, healthcare, and education priorities of the region. We know that students educated in rural settings are more likely to return to rural communities. Myriad state and national factors only amplify a challenging budget climate for UNK and the NU system.

Guided by the UNK mission, the Deans of the University of Nebraska at Kearney have recommended to Senior Vice Chancellor Julie Shaffer and Interim Chancellor Charlie Bicak a thorough reevaluation and proposed reorganization of the university's colleges. We collaborated in the development of draft mission, vision, and values statements. The process was guided by two overarching goals: 1) seek synergies to strengthen programs and stakeholder impact and 2) bolster operational efficiencies.

We do not bring forward these proposed changes lightly. These proposals are guided by the 2021 and 2023 Faculty Advisory Committee (FAC) recommendations that the "UNK Administration consider the educational needs of Nebraska over the next 5-10-20 years and consider all programs, not based on current strength, but what may be needed to ensure success of the rural health initiatives, the success of state workforce initiatives, and to position greater Nebraska into a stance of strength." We believe that this proposal for redevelopment will serve the needs of greater Nebraska into the future and place UNK on solid ground.

This announcement is the first element of a consultative process that will include university stakeholders, insights from third party consultants, and the development of an academic master plan that will include the reallocation of financial resources to meet our needs. This process will be guided by Senior Vice Chancellor Julie Shaffer and is expected to be finalized by August 2026.

The three academic colleges that have been proposed are the: 1) College of Business, Technology, and Professional Studies 2) College of Education and Humanities, and 3) College of Health and Science. A description of each college, along with the library and the graduate studies and academic innovation, is provided at the end of this document. We seek to collaborate with the faculty to inform this process going forward.

College of Business, Technology, and Professional Studies

Vision Statement

To advance our region through economic, social, and academic progress by empowering students, engaging industry, and creating community.

To provide transformative career-focused programs dedicated to exceptional student experiences and regional economic development in Nebraska.

This heritage also includes strong programs that promote and ensure critical thinking, analysis, writing, and problem-solving skills that produce teachers for every level of Nebraska education and venue. Bringing those programs together in one college emphasizes that broad impact and reinforces our identity as the hub for rural education, outreach, engagement, and the humanities in Nebraska. As the landscape of higher education

and its funding change, it is ever more important to demonstrate to our system, state, and federal leadership and advocates the importance of strong, well-prepared Nebraska teachers, communicators, and citizens. Bringing these faculty together emphasizes our shared mission and ensures our vitality and purpose well into the future. All of the programs within this college graduate a majority of educators in both conventional and less conventional senses such as in outreach, exhibition, and performance. We also bring together excellent graduate education programs throughout the college in Teacher Education, Educational Administration, Counseling and School Psychology, and throughout the arts and humanities. This continues to emphasize our identity and importance to the state while ensuring the vitality of the arts and humanities for generations of students to come.

College of Health and Science

The programs benefit from increased collaboration. The faculty benefit from a focus of resources and enhanced opportunities to collaborate programmatically and in scholarly activity.
