Honors Program Application Frequently Asked Questions

We strongly recommend that you prepare your essay responses and resume ahead of time by utilizing a word processing program. Then, upload the files into the appropriate places in the application.

- 1. **Eligibility for the UNK Honors Program Admittance**: All admitted UNK students who have demonstrated academic motivation, intellectual curiosity, and a strong commitment to personal growth are welcome to apply for Honors Program admittance.
- 2. Eligibility for the UNK Honors Program Scholarships: All UNK Honors Program first-time freshmen applicants who have gained admittance are reviewed for scholarships if the application is completed and submitted by <u>January 7</u>. All first-time freshmen applicants who have not yet gained admittance to the Honors Program should apply and complete both admittance and scholarship sections by <u>January 7</u>. All other applicants (international, transfer, and current students) are not reviewed for scholarships in this application.
- 3. **Getting Started**: Select your status from the drop-down menu:
 - a. *First-Time Freshman*: You are graduating high school soon and have not been a full-time resident of a college or university.
 - b. *Transfer Student*: You are attending another college or university and are transferring (or are interested in transferring) to UNK.
 - c. Currently Enrolled Student at UNK: You are currently attending UNK. If you are a transfer student or international student who is currently taking classes at UNK, you should select this one.
 - d. *International Student, new to UNK*: You are not currently attending UNK, but are interesting in attending UNK the following semester.
- 4. **NUID:** You need an NUID to apply. If you have been admitted to UNK, you should have received an NUID. If you have not been admitted to UNK, you must do so before applying to the UNK Honors Program.
- 5. **High School Transcript or Secondary School Transcript (International):** Although you can use your 3-year unofficial transcript for this submission because you have not graduated, you must obtain this transcript from your guidance counselor or an official at your school. Do not submit screenshots of your grades from your online student information system.
- 6. College Transcripts or Grade Check Form (Transfer or Current Student applicants only): If you are in your very first semester of full-time residency at another university or college, you will need to use the grade check form and upload it. If you are in your second semester or beyond at another university, you should upload your college transcript instead.

- 7. School Official Recommendation, Achievements, or Standardized Test Scores (International applicants only): If you have multiple documents (a letter and an award certificate), place these documents into one file and then upload. You will be required to upload a DOC, DOCX, or PDF file.
- 8. **ACT or SAT scores**: We accept unofficial scores. <u>A tutorial on how to print the unofficial scores from the ACT website is here</u>. The SATs should be similar.
- 9. **Size of class / rank in class**: This is optional. If your school does not report this, you can leave it blank.
- 10. **Resume**: You are required to submit a resume. <u>Use the Honors Program resume</u> format or a similar format. This format will help the Honors staff when reviewing your application.
- 11. Admittance Essay Question: This essay is required to be considered for admittance to the Honors Program. The current admittance essay prompt is: "The Honors Program challenges students to go above and beyond by fostering intellectual curiosity. Describe what it means to be an Honors Program student in the community, in the classroom, on the field, or anywhere." Include your response to the above prompt in a well-structured essay (500 words is a suggested length). Make sure you write your essay offline using word processing software. You will be required to upload a DOC, DOCX, or PDF file.
- 12. **Scholarship Essay Question**: Scholarship applications are for *first-time freshmen* only. If transfer, current, or international students apply as a first-time freshman, your application will be discarded. The current scholarship essay prompt is: "At this point in your life, describe two things that you don't know. You can describe how this relates to your desire to join a program of study, something interesting about yourself, about serving others, etc." Include your response to the above prompt in a well-structured essay (500 words is a suggested length). Make sure you write your essay offline using word processing software. You will be required to upload a DOC, DOCX, or PDF file.
- 13. Letter of Recommendation: For scholarship applicants only, we will ask you to submit the name and email address of a person who would provide a letter of recommendation. You might ask a high school teacher, counselor, or other relevant individual who can attest to your academic abilities and potential for success in the Honors Program to submit this recommendation letter. When you submit your application, the email address of the person provided will be sent an email with instructions on how to upload and submit a recommendation letter for you. Make sure you speak with your person providing your recommendation in advance, so they are aware of the deadlines and the expected email. This recommender should submit their letter no later than January 7.

14. Submission Deadlines:

- a. Scholarship applications are due by January 7. Late submissions will not be considered.
- b. All applications seeking admittance must be received by April 1.
- 15. **Notification**: Applicants will be notified of their <u>admittance</u> status according to their application date (see below). If admitted, your admittance letter will provide instructions on the next steps. All scholarship statuses will be communicated on January 31.
