December session >>>


Communication & Teamwork

January session >>>


Advocacy & Diversity

Following the activity, the group heard from a panel consisting of Ashley Olivas, Senior TRIO Advisor; Dr. Douglas Biggs, Interim Assistant Vice Chancellor for International Affairs; and Sarah Mattson, Assistant Director of Disability Services.
