

Provides a partial tuition waiver for up to eight semesters

Renewal Criteria

- Cumulative GPA 3.0 or greater
- Successfully complete 24 or more semester hours each academic year.

**Grade point average and hour completion are reviewed at the end of each spring semester to determine renewability. Students are notified via email and paper mail, at their permanent address, if they do not meet the renewal criteria and lose their scholarship.*

If you enroll and receive the Cooperating School Scholarship you will be agreeing to the terms and conditions of the scholarship as described

Reminder

The Cooperating School Scholarship is awarded to students nominated by their high school. The University provides school districts who host UNK student teachers this scholarship in partial or full amounts based upon other academic scholarships awarded to the student.

Conditions of the Scholarship

- Must begin within one year after high school graduation. If you will not enroll for the first time until the second semester following graduation, you must, in writing, notify the Office of Financial Aid by August 1st. You may not attend another institution during the fall semester.
- Must be a full-time student at UNK (12 or more credit hours) each semester. Failure to enroll for a semester will result in forfeiture of the scholarship. Enrollment status will be checked on the last day of the first week of classes (drop and add week). The scholarship will be canceled and forfeited if you are not at full-time status at that time.
- Cannot be transferred to another institution, this includes the University of Nebraska Medical Center.
- May not be used during the summer term.
- Eligibility will end once upon receipt of a bachelor's degree or after eight semesters, whichever comes first.
- Scholarship amount, in combination with other scholarships, cannot exceed the estimated cost of attendance, nor total tuition charges. Scholarship amount will be reduced as needed.
- Award will not apply to account until official documents (high school transcript and official test scores) are received by the University of Nebraska at Kearney's Office of Undergraduate Admissions.
