Sponsorship of Royalty will not be included in the Homecoming Competition; therefore, **ANY RECOGNIZED STUDENT ORGANIZATION OR CAMPUS SPONSORED STUDENT GROUP MAY SPONSOR TWO ELIGIBLE CANDIDATES!** Every year a Homecoming King and Queen are chosen and are asked to positively represent UNK for one year following their crowning.

**Rules:**

1. Candidate must complete the Royalty Entry Form and turn it in prior to or at the photo shoot.
2. The candidate must be a member of the organization they are representing.
3. Only UNK juniors and seniors are eligible to be nominated for royalty. Junior status is defined as a full-time undergraduate student enrolled at UNK who has completed at least **58** hours.
4. Homecoming Royalty Finalists from previous years cannot be nominated again regardless of the organization they are affiliated with.

**Royalty pictures will be taken on Thursday, September 17 from 1:00 pm - 3:00 pm in the Communications Building - Studio. Ask for Todd.** It is required that all candidates wear business attire for the photo shoot- blue and gold is always a good choice ;). The Homecoming Committee will appoint one photographer to take ALL Royalty photos.

The winners of the Royalty competition will be determined by popular vote. Each Royalty candidate will have his/her photo displayed in the Student Union. Voting will take place via student e-mail accounts.

Announcement of the Homecoming candidates and finalists will be announced during the Discovery Hall Grand Opening. The King and Queen will be announced during the Lip Sync Competition in the Health and Sports Center Arena, and additionally at halftime of the Homecoming football scrimmage.

On Thursday, October 8, Royalty finalists need to attend Lip Sync and Royalty Crowning.

On Saturday, October 10, there are two events which Royalty finalists need to attend. 1) King, Queen and Court will ride in the Homecoming Spirit March at 12:00 pm. 2) The Royalty & Court must be in attendance for the 3:00 pm Football scrimmage as they will be introduced during half time of the game.

<b>Lawn Display Competition</b>

1. Displays may cover a 20 ft long x 20 ft wide x 20 ft high area.
2. Displays must be freestanding.
3. Decisions due to extreme conditions such as weather and/or vandalism will be left up to the judges.
4. Make sure the name of your organization is clearly visible for the judges.
5. Judging will take place at 4:15 pm on Monday, October 5. You may begin to set up as early as 2:30 pm.
6. A tear down date will be announced by the Homecoming Chairs, determined by the week's weather, etc. Our desire is for the display to be up the entire week to promote spirit and all the homecoming activities.
7. The organization is responsible for removing the displays from the campus. Please do not overfill the dumpsters.
8. Judging will be based on the following criteria:
  - a) Overall Team Participation
  - b) Originality
  - c) Loper Spirit
  - d) Quality of Workmanship
  - e) Correlation of Theme
  - f) Overall Affect
9. **Decisions by the judges are final. Disputes with judges or chair persons will not be tolerated.**

***Risk and Responsibility forms must be turned in for the entire team before 5:15 pm.***

The goal of the adventure race is for your team to make it through a series of clues, physical challenges, and mental challenges and be the first team back. Remember this year's theme – it will definitely be incorporated into the challenges of this event.

1. Each team participating for Sweepstakes points must have 6 members per team. Members must be split 3 women and 3 men. **Each group can only have one competing team.**
2. Each station requires two members from the team go to that station.
3. There will be approximately 12 challenges/stations.
4. Each team will begin at the green space by the Bell Tower to receive their clues.
5. LPAC station leaders will be in each location to ensure the groups are completing tasks correctly.
6. Specific routes will not be disclosed prior to the event. Each team will cover a different route.
7. Incentives may be given to teams who have extra participants cheering them on!

**Judges decisions are final. Disputes with judges or chair persons will result in disqualification & loss of competition points**

RULES

1. Each team consists of 6 players, you must keep the same 6 players!
2. The player in the first position will begin each game.
3. Each game will consist of three questions, and the team with the most points at the end of the game will be declared the winner.
4. Round 1 will be single points, round 2 will be double, and Round 3 will be triple points.
5. The event will be played as a single elimination tournament.
6. When the event is down to 2 teams, a fast money round will be played, where one player from each team will participate to determine the winner of the event.
7. Third place will be determined by a fast money round before the final round begins.
8. No one in the audience is permitted to help the teams playing in any way.
9. Each team will get three strikes for the round.
10. When a team receives their 2<sup>nd</sup> strike, the opposing team may quietly begin discussing a possible answer.
11. When a team receives their 3<sup>rd</sup> strike, the opposing team has 10 seconds to answer the question.
12. A third-party judge will decide if answers are worded closely enough to be considered correct.
13. Spirit points will be awarded to the team with the most attendance and enthusiasm.

Check-in for participating organizations begins at 6:00 pm. ***Risk and Responsibility forms must be turned in for the entire team before 6:45 pm. Extras are located on the [unk.edu/homecoming](http://unk.edu/homecoming) website!***

1. Organizations may enter only one group.
2. Judging will be based on the following criteria:
  - a. Appearance/Costumes
  - b. Originality and Creativity
  - c. Choreography
  - d. Lip Sync Talent
  - e. Song Choice
3. A maximum of 10 songs can be used/reserved. You are encouraged to only turn in final selections. Please email Jamie Ticas Flores ([ticasfloresja@loppers.unk.edu](mailto:ticasfloresja@loppers.unk.edu)) with your song selections from 8:00 am on Wednesday, September 16 through Friday, September 18 at noon. Each team must have a representative available at the song meeting on Friday, September 18 at 4:00 pm in room 142 of the Student Union. We will review all song selections and duplicates. \*Each sound bite counts as one of your songs!
4. Each group must submit one .mp3 file for their music selection. ***Lists of songs or music files will not be accepted any sooner than Wednesday, September 16. The Final Copy and List is due Monday, October 5 to Jamie Ticas Flores by 5:00 p.m. Have music file clearly labeled with the names of your group accompanied by a list of songs via email.***
5. Each group will be given an assigned time to perform. The group is to check in at 6:30 pm at the registration table. The order of the groups will be assigned prior to this time.
6. **Song titles** must be included with your music file when submitted. No two groups may use the same song. **In case of duplicate entries, the one received first will take precedence.**
7. Music selected by groups may pertain to the Homecoming themes, but it is not required.
8. **LPAC is not responsible for music files that will not play.** Files will be tested, but please test yourself as well. Remember to turn up the volume when editing music.
9. The length of a group's performance must adhere to a maximum of 5 minutes. The group will be penalized 5 points for each 10 seconds over the maximum 5 minutes.
10. One group cannot transfer or split points with another group.

11. Stage size is 16'x32' (or use main floor?) – plan team size and choreography accordingly. All components of your performance **must be on the stage**. Change over must happen quickly, NO more than 2 minutes should be needed for change over.
12. If at any time the performance is unacceptable according to the Lip Sync rules and the discretion of the Lip Sync Homecoming Chair, music will be turned off and participants will be escorted off the stage
13. Weapons of any kind are illegal on the UNK Campus and are not allowed.
14. Cancellations must be reported to the Nebraskan Student Union or Homecoming chair by 12:00 noon, Tuesday, October 6.
15. **Sexually explicit, vulgar, obscene or racially slurred lyrics or actions will not be permitted.** Risqué costuming or racial body painting is not allowed. ***If the Lip Sync judges consider the performance to be in poor taste, a lower score or no points will be awarded.***
16. One layer of clothing must be kept on at all times, top and bottom. (no midribs exposed please)
17. **Flips, risky routines, and touching during the Lip Sync performance are not allowed. The judges have the right to decide if anything is too risky. Violations will result in serious point reductions.** (This includes jumping off the stage, unsteady props such as standing on folding chairs). Shields may be required at the time of performance, but will be provided by LPAC if needed.
18. Participants are required to have the Risk and Responsibility Form signed and turned in before performing. Participation will not be allowed without the signed form.
19. Props are encouraged; however each group is responsible for the set up/tear down of their own props. LPAC does not provide assistance. Props must be easily cleaned up and removed from the stage immediately after your performance (i.e. No glitter, confetti etc).
20. LPAC will provide a basic blue backdrop. This year NO BACKDROPS OF YOUR OWN WILL BE ALLOWED.
21. **Judges decisions are final. Disputes with judges or chair persons will be disqualified & lose competition points.**
22. **\*\*It is strongly recommended that each team reserve space in the Health & Sports Center for rehearsals in order to practice social distancing.\*\***

1. Teams will have exactly 30 minutes to construct their canned food display. Only 10 members are allowed to build and anyone building is required to wear gloves, which will be provided.
2. Display must be limited to space provided which will be 8'x16'.
3. Canned Food must be the only material supporting the structure. Other materials are allowed as long as they are not the main support or frame of the structure. Paper, tape, other materials can be used as decoration, but NOT to hold cans together or support the structure.
4. The display should be spirit-oriented, supporting the Lopers and the Homecoming Games, keeping in mind this year's theme.
5. Cans may be acquired through purchasing or donations.
6. Labels on cans MUST be intact at the end of the event. Any paper or decoration must be removed.
7. Each organization is responsible for moving their display to the Big Blue Cupboard or NSU 142 immediately following the announcement of winners. Any team that does not help will face loss of points.
8. Judging will be based on the following criteria:
  - a. Participation
  - b. Number of Cans Used
  - c. Originality/Competition
  - d. Promotion of Loper Spirit
  - e. Quality of Workmanship
  - f. Correlation to Theme
  - g. Overall Affect
9. **Judges decisions are final. Disputes with judges or chair persons will result in disqualification & loss of competition points.**

Team names must be easily visible at time of Banner judging and during parade in order to receive float points!

#### RULES FOR BANNER COMPETITION

1. **“The Next Frontier”** is the 2020 Homecoming theme. Each banner must identify with the theme or demonstrate Loper spirit.

~~2. Maximum Height – 15 ft. (measured from the ground up).  
Maximum Width – 15 ft.  
Maximum Length – 63 ft.~~

3. A banner entry form must be completed and submitted by Friday, October 2 by 5:00 pm to the Nebraskan Student Union Office. The form is located in the forms section of this handbook.
4. All banners must be checked in by 10:30 am at the Health Science Education Complex parking lot. **If your banner is not there by 10:30 am, it will not be judged!** Judging will begin at 10:45 am. Teams will receive parade position the morning of the parade at the check-in table or you can log onto [www.unk.edu/homecoming](http://www.unk.edu/homecoming) the day before. Your banner must be at the Health Science Education Complex in order to be judged. First, second and third place banners will be presented with a banner to carry during the parade.
5. Entries depicting alcohol consumption or advertising alcoholic beverages are not allowed. Sexually explicit, vulgar, obscene or racially slurred “art” will not be permitted.
6. Judging criteria will include:
  - a. Originality – 50 points
  - b. Identification with the theme – 50 points
  - c. Quality of workmanship – 50 points
  - d. Overall effect – 50 points
  - e. Group Attire reflecting the theme may lead to a bonus 20 points per team.
7. Announcement of the banner and the overall Homecoming Competition winners will be announced at half-time of the football scrimmage. Please have a representative from your organization present and close to the field at this time to receive your awards. Encourage your entire team to come cheer you on!

~~8. In case a float is vandalized, a special judging committee, appointed by the Homecoming Committee will judge the vandalized float for competition points. Although the float will be unable to participate in the Parade, it will still be eligible for the Homecoming Competition.~~

9. Each entry is responsible for removal and clean-up of their banner.
10. Area personalities will announce the parade from stations along the route. Descriptions of each entry have been set for the announcers according to the established line-up; therefore please maintain your assigned place.
11. Spacing will be tight in the line-up areas to accommodate more than 100 entries in the parade. You will be able to spread out as the parade begins to move. Once you are on the actual parade route near the Health Science Education Center, **please maintain the spacing you had at that point trying not to leave gaps.**
12. Beverages of any kind will not be allowed in the parade. You are also not allowed to throw/handout candy or give out any handouts.
13. Any entry violating these regulations will be immediately dismissed from the parade by a parade official. (Dismissed entries will be disqualified from receiving parade points).
14. **Judges decisions are final. Disputes with judges or chair persons will be disqualified & lose competition points.**
