KINDERGARTEN PREP ACADEMY

Jump start your child's academic and social readiness by enrolling them in the Kindergarten Prep Academy. During these four weeks of exploration, children will practice common kindergarten procedures and routines, develop fine motor skills, begin phonemic (reading) awareness, and work on numerical understanding. Students will also work on social and emotional regulation to help them excel when they begin kindergarten this fall. This academy is held at the Plambeck Center.

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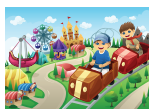

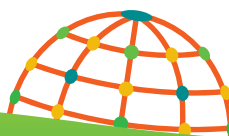
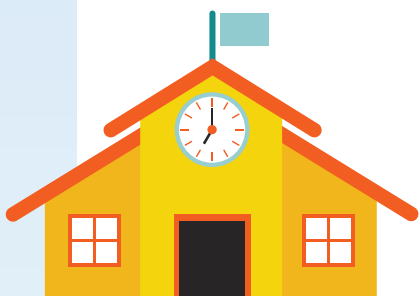
