Benchmarks

To focus discussions about the importance of student engagement and to guide institutional improvement efforts, NSSE created five Benchmarks of Effective Educational Practice: Level of Academic Challenge, Active and Collaborative Learning, Student-Faculty Interaction, Enriching Educational Experiences, and Supportive Campus Environment.

Class

Sample

This report is based on information from all randomly selected students (including those from census administrations) for your institution. Targeted oversamples and other nonrandomly selected students are not included.

Mean

The mean is the arithmetic average of the students' benchmark scores where students answered at least 3/5ths of the benchmark items.

Ν

The N column represents the actual number of students who contributed to the benchmark mean. Students who did not respond to at least 3/5ths of each benchmark's items are not included.

Weighting

All major field results displayed in this report are <u>unweighted</u>. The benchmark scores in the overall column are weighted, as they are in your Institutional Report.

Benchmark scores are reported separately for first-year students and seniors. Insitution-reported class levels are used. Of course, first-year student reports of major are likely to be unstable, and interpretations of their results should be made with caution.
