COURSE DESCRIPTION:

This course is an in-depth study of the behavior and ecology of cranes. Assigned readings from the scientific literature, one writing assignment and online discussions will be used to explore a variety of topics including: reproductive biology, wintering ecology, migratory behavior, conservation and management of cranes. Plan to spend at least several hours each week on reading, writing, and participating in topic discussions. Offered online, Fall of odd-numbered years.

PREREQUISITES: None

INSTRUCTIONAL METHOD: In this class, we will combine lectures with readings from the scientific literature to introduce students to the biology of North American crane species. We will have group discussions of the scientific literature and students will work in groups to create a research proposal on a topic related to crane biology.

STUDENT LEARNING OUTCOMES:

By the end of this course, students will:

1. Learn to obtain and evaluate scientific research articles from the primary literature
2. Examine and discuss four major components of crane biology for two North American Crane species (Sandhill Cranes and Whooping Cranes)
3. Identify differences in conducting research for an abundant vs. an endangered species
4. Propose a novel research idea, based on a focused review of one aspect of crane biology

COURSE REQUIREMENTS:

Students are required to observe and take notes on lectures and read scientific literature prior to participating in group discussions. *All deadlines will be communicated in Canvas.*

ATTENDANCE POLICY:

No formal attendance will be taken in this course, but regular participation in course activities each week is required.
