## Office of the Senior Vice Chancellor of Academic and Student Affairs Call for Spring 2021 Three-Week Session Course Offerings January 3 – January 21, 2022

The Spring 2022 three-week session, January 3 – January 21, provides an opportunity to help our students continue their educational progress.

The Office of the Senior Vice Chancellor of Academic and Student Affairs announces a call for proposals to develop and offer courses that provide experiential and career-readiness learning opportunities via online or in-person delivery for the Spring 2022 three-week session.

We encourage proposals that creatively meet the varying needs of our students in content, course format, and number of credit hours. A few ideas to consider might include:

- a course focused on discrete career-readiness skills, such as learning a coding language or other technical skill, entrepreneur basics, developing social media skills, including creating a personal brand
- a project-based research course
- a special focus on a "wicked problem" or grand challenge question
- a course that provides experiential learning opportunities centered on our current moment (e.g., social justice, environment, equity, etc.)
- a class that develops engagement with community groups, non-governmental organizations, or industry partners
- an existing class broken down into smaller components or modules that allows flexibility
- a gateway class that enables students to continue degree progress
- a course that connects with an international institution through shared virtual classrooms
- a supervised internship, externship, or job-shadow experience

Proposals, including evidence of approval by chairs, must be submitted by 5 p.m. September 3, 2021 to Dr. Peter Longo (<a href="longo@unk.edu">longo@unk.edu</a>). Spring three-week courses are considered part of the spring 2022 term. The expectation is the three-week session courses will be built into the faculty teaching load.
